Learning and Work Expectations	
Student Expectations	Teacher Expectations
<p>Students will maintain a passing grade. If the student's grade drops below passing, the teacher will notify the student and parent/guardian.</p> <p>Any student who does not maintain passing grades will be referred to the administration.</p>	<p>Teachers will grade virtual assignments in a timely manner to keep the grade book current. Teachers will notify students and parent/guardian if a student grade drops below passing.</p>
<p>Students will complete all work as assigned by their teachers. Due dates for work will be determined by each teacher. Late work policy will be determined by each teacher.</p>	<p>Assignments will be posted no later than the end of each assigned class period. Students will be provided a minimum of 24 hours to complete assignments from the time of the posting.</p>
<p>Academic dishonesty will not be tolerated. Students are expected to complete their own work. Copying from online sources or duplicating another student's work will result in a penalty to be determined by the teacher</p> <p>Please refer to the student handbook.</p>	
<p>Students will be active learners. Students may be asked to Zoom live for class instruction, discussion and assessment.</p>	<p>Teachers will continue to create lessons and learning materials that provide instruction using varied techniques to maximize student success. Teachers will continue to use Google classroom to post instruction and materials.</p>
<p>Students will check Infinite Campus weekly to track their own progress.</p>	<p>Teachers will grade in a timely manner.</p>
<p>Students requiring IEP services, or those having special needs will have the opportunity to come into school on an as-needed basis to ensure those needs are being met.</p> <p>This will be determined by the school administrators, intervention specialists, teachers and school counselor in conjunction with parents.</p>

<p>Students will make every effort to attend Zoom meetings. If the student is unable to attend a Zoom meeting, they will notify the teacher <i>before</i> the scheduled meeting. Accommodations will be made on a case by case basis.</p>	<p>Teachers will continue to host a minimum of one Zoom meeting each week for remote learners.</p> <p>Zoom meetings will be password protected.</p> <p>Zoom meetings will only be open to students on the teacher's roster.</p> <p>The meeting host will enable all security features</p> <p>The teacher's camera will only be on the speaker or the presentation.</p> <p>Both the general education teacher and the intervention specialist will participate in all Zoom meetings held for co-taught classes. Teachers should coordinate a schedule that</p>
<p>Students will maintain regular contact with their teacher. Students should check in regularly using email, phone calls, or Zoom meetings. If a student consistently fails to communicate with their teacher, the students will be referred to administration</p>	<p>Teachers will clearly communicate the expectations for Zoom meetings and weekly contact with students.</p>
<p>Extra help Zoom meetings will be scheduled on an individual basis, as needed.</p>

<p>Students will earn their attendance by logging-in daily to each Google classroom and completing a check-in assignment.</p>	<p>Teachers will create a daily check-in assignment on their Google classroom and mark student attendance for that day based on completion of the check-in assignment.</p>
